

LOST GREEN CARD (I-551) QUESTIONNAIRE

Under United States law, only the Department of Homeland Security can issue a replacement Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-551 or “Green Card”); the Department of State and U.S. Embassy in Yaounde cannot issue a replacement. If you are a Legal Permanent Resident (LPR) whose I-551 has been lost or stolen, you will need to return to the U.S. to file a Form I-90 with the Department of Homeland Security. To return to the U.S., you will need a transportation letter, which can be issued by the U.S. Embassy.

Before the U.S. Embassy can issue a transportation letter, the Department of Homeland Security must confirm your LPR status and authorize the Embassy to issue the letter. Please note that it frequently takes more than a month for DHS to confirm LPR status. **Also, please note that the Embassy has no control or influence over DHS’s activities and will not be able to speed up DHS’s processing of your case.**

The fee for transportation letter is \$165.00, payable in U.S. dollars or CFA francs.
